Presidential Election. PROCLAMATION. WHEREAS, by an act of Assembly of the Commonwealth, entitled, "An act relating to the election in this Commonwealth," it is enjoined upon me to give public notice of such election to be held, and also the enumeration in such notice what officers are to be elected, I, JOHN N. WESTON, High Sheriff of the county of Bradford, do hereby make known and give notice to the electors of said county, that a GENERAL ELECTION will be held in said county, on FRIDAY, the 1st day of November in the several districts in said county, to wit: In the district of ALBANY, at the school house in the north district near the house of W. And in and by said act, I am further directed to give notice "that every person excepting justices of the peace, who shall hold any office or appointment of profit and trust under the government of the United States, or of this state, or of any city or incorporated district, whether a commissioned officer or agent who is, or shall be employed under the legislative, executive or judiciary department of this state, or of United States, or of any incorporated district, and also that every member of Congress, and of the state Legislature, and of the select or common council of any city, or commissioners of any incorporated district, is, by law, incapable of holding or exercising, at the same time, the office or appointment of judge, inspector or clerk of any election in this Commonwealth, and that no inspector, judge or other officer of any such election, shall be then eligible to any office to be voted for."

By the 4th section of an act passed the 16th day of April, 1840, it is provided, "that the 13th section of the act passed July 2d, 1839, entitled "an act relating to the electors of this Commonwealth," shall not be so construed, as to prevent any militia officer from serving as judge, inspector or clerk, at any general or special election of this Commonwealth."

In the 61st section of the act first mentioned it is enacted, that "every general and special election shall be open between eight and ten in forenoon and shall continue without interruption or adjournment until seven o'clock in the evening, when the polls shall be closed."

It is further directed, that the meeting of the Judges at the Court House, in the Borough of Towanda, to make out the general return, shall be on the third day after the election, which will be on the 4th day of November.
