





And in and hy said act, I am further directed to give notice " that every person excepting justices of the peace, who shall hold any office or i appointment of profit and trust under the govmment of the United States, or of this state, or of any city or incorporated district, whether a commissioned officer or agent who is, or shall be employed under the legislative, executive or judiciary deportment of this state, or of United States, or of any incorporated district, and also that every member of Congress, and of the state Legislature, and of the select or common council of any city, or commissioners of any incorporated district, is, by law, incapable of holding or exercising, at the same time, the office or appointment of judge, inspector or clerk of any election of this commonwealth, and that no in-spector, judge or other officer of any such election, shall be then eligible to any office to be voted for.

By the 4th section of an act passed, the 16th day of April, 1840, it is provided, " that the 13th section of the act passed July 2d, 1839, entitled an act relating to the electors of this Commonwealth," shall not be so construed, as to prevent any militia officer from serving asjudge, inspector or clerk, at any general or special election of this commonwealth.

In the 61st section of the act first mentioned t is enacted, that "every general and special election shall be open between eight and ten in forencon and shall continue without inferruption or adjournment until seven o'clock in the evening, when the polls shall be closed. It is further directed, that the meeting of the

Judges at the Court House, in the borough of Fowmda, to make out the general return, shall be on the third day after the election, which will be on the 4th day of November.
