It is further directed, that the meeting of the judges at the court house, in Towanda, to make out the gene-ral return, shall be on the third day after the election, which will be on the 13th of October.

The Conference of this Congressional district will meet at the court house, in the borough of Towanda, on the seventh day after the election, which will be on the the 17th day of October.
