To it is attached a Summer Pixture, upon the boiler holes of which, he wash boiler belonging to the stove can be used, thereby rendering it in capacity equal to a six boiler stove. Goals can be transferred from the fire-box directly into the Summer Fixure, by being drawnforward, without the use of a shovel. By throwing open the front doors of the fire-box, when broiling or other cooking is done in the Summer Fixure, the funes from the articles cooking are carried off through the stove, without being disseminated into the room. The top of the upen is protected by an iron plate to prevent an excess of heat upon the articles taking. It can be removed, if the heat is needed to be increased. The examination to bake with great uniformity in all its parts.

The only damper for turning the current of heat is a rolling one at the pipe-hole. By being turned forward, the heat is made to press under the overs, before ascending the pipe. The opening for the purpose of cleaning the flues, is in the lower part of the front plate. The flues, which are three in number—two appearand two under—are liberal in size, and afford a good draft to the stove. They are perfectly smooth, and without obstruction from the front to the back of the stove, and can be easily cleaned with a poker, such as is furnished.

The fire or guard plate can be taken out, and a new one put in, without taking the stove to pieces. But being well protected with cold air, is seldom, if
