## Herrible death from Hydronhobia

The following is from the Philadelphia Inquirer \_A man, named Henry Ba chelor, aged about 24 ears, died on Saturday evening at his residence in revise's alley, rouning from Shippen street; above Fifh, from the horrible effects of hydrophobia. He was bitten some three weeks since in the arm and leg. by his own dog, with which he was playing. and was soon after received into the Pennsylvania Hospital for medical treatment. The animal was immediately shot : and it was only within lew day past that the dreadful malarly began to assume an alarming stage. We are told the suffering of the untorinate man in the end, were distressing. On the evening of his death, at his urgent desire, Dr. W J. Duffee was called in about nine o'clock. On the Doctor taking his leave, the sufferer requested him to return and in a clear and distinct tone. begged one favor. Dr D. asked him whathe wish when he said, extending his right hand as far s possible and spitting rapidly at the same time -"You are a surgeon—open a vein in my asm, for God's sake and bleed me to death rather than see me die in this horrible way!" Of course, the re quest which appears quite natural under the painful circumstances was not complied with, when the wretched man made an attempt at prayer, and in in the brief period of half an hour expired in the presence of his friends.
