If any one question the correctness of this remark, let him examine his resources at once. Let him take into consideration the nature and character of his soil-the geological formation on which it rests, and the description of alimentary matter most proper to be applied. One farmer occupies a farm, the soil of which is light and excessively friable; it is too porous and unconsolidate in its texture to insure a favorable action of the putrescent manuses applied for its amelioration, requiring an addition of some ingredient which will alter, effectually and permanently, its physical conformation, and obviate the too great fendency to to burn up" or "waste," without equable and actual fermentation, the organic substances applied for the support of the crops. Clay, is the proper alterant. By overlaying the yards in which the cattle are confined with a stratum of this earth, and mixing it thoroughly with the solid and tiquid excrements of the animals, and then subsequently removing it to some convenient and proper locality where it can be still farther enriched by the addition and action of other ingredients, fit for correpost, it will be made a most desirable and efficient fertilizer, and its action will be permanent on any soil in which there is too great a quantity of sand. On close and viscid clay, the application of sand is equally beneficial as that of clay on sand.

The too great unctuosity of this description of soil, which produces a tendency, in damp weather to adhere in plastic masses, and when dry, to bake in solid strata, or compact masses, impermeable to the roots of vegetables, is a serious impediment in the way of its cultivation. Lands of this texture are generally, from the melting of the snows in the spring, and the frequent, protracted and copious rains of that season, too soft to admit of their being worked with any degree of perfection, and this condition of things is continued generally, till-it is too late to sow or plant with even a tolerable prospect of success. But by adding sand, an absorbent power is superinduced, by which this defect is, in a great measure obviated. The constitutional amelioration thus produced, is permanent and the land may be cropped in any grain for years; or indeed for an indefinite period without any upleasant con- lungs, accompanied with a distressing cough; after sequences from either of the two extremes of drought or excessive wet.

I am aware that the application of constitutional alterants, or of those substances which by thei' presence and action effect a radical change in the complexion and physical character of soils, cannot properly be discussed under the head of manusing, yet if is a point of vast practical importance to the farmer, and should by no means be overlooked or lost sight of in any system of agrestic improvement involving labor, or the bestowment of manure. Many of the finest gardens in the United States, have been formed by amalgamating the primitive earths; and I have now in my mind's eye several which are based on lands that thirty years ago were regarded as oftenly worthless, and were actually purchased by their present proprietions, in some instances for a sum not exceeding one-eight of the amount realized from the sale of a sto distinguish his preparations from all o hers. one-eight of the amount realized from the sale of the marketable produce of a syngle year.

As, in the vicinity of clay and rand formations there is generally, though not necessarily or invariably so, in all cases the material necessary for their improvement, the cost of the undertaking is never so great as those not familiar with this fact are apt to approse. I would advise every one who doubts the efficiency of this practice, to reduce it at once to the proper test.


