This should be a bosy month to the farmer. Manufes if not already curted out where likely to be wanted, should be attended to. Place your manure in convenient sized heaps, at proper distances apart, and cover the tops of the heaps slightly with charcoal dust, pulverulent muck or peat, or a slight coating of claster of paris Enher of these will arrest, in part at least, the ammonia escaping with he first warm day. Prepare ground as early as possible, and spread no more manure at the time than can be plowed within a few hours. It you cannot obtain any of the above-named articles to cover the manure hears until required for use, throw a few shovels full of soil over each bear.

If you have pursued the barbarous curtom of leaving manares exprised all winter in cow yards, without protection from the atmosphere, cart it out immediately, as directed in the beginning of this article, and thus stop the grea ter wastes arising from warmer weather. If you have any manure more than will be wanted for spring use, make it into compost with muck, peat, pond mud, or even headlands, rather than lose the more valuable parts of its constituents by leaving it unprotected. If you can put it under cover; and ti you have no manure sheds, cover the heaps with any of the absorbents of ammenia before named.-An occasional sprinkling on its surface of water, in which one one-thousandth of its weight of sulphuric acid has been mixed, will be serviceable by changing the carbonate of animonia to the sufphate, and thus preventing its evaporation, and consequent loss.

Preserving Cabbage. In the last number of the "Newspaper," I noticed an inquiry by "W. P." of Virginia, as to the best mode of setting away cabbages, as well as the best time to do so to prevent them from rotting. I have been in the habit of burying cabbages about the last of Octo ber, for several years past, and never knew a head of the number to rot. The following is my method:—Dig a trench about two feeet wide and eight verticated, and the woman at middle age—the one we to invite the following is my method:—Dig a trench about two feeet wide and eight or ten inches deep, place the cabbage in this trench with the heads down and roots up; then throw the scattering leaves on and cover it up with dirt. covering all but the points of the roots. Put no boards or straw about them. If these directions are followed, your cabbage will never ret.

Moss upon Arple Trees. - We suppose it is a fact that no apple tree that is covered with mosses can be considered a healthy tree. It is however a matter of doubt with us whether these mosses fasten upon the tree while it is vigorous and healthy and reduce it to a diseased state, or whether it is necessary that there should be some diseased condition of the bark before it will afford suitable ground for them to flourish in. These masses or nchens are to the trees on which they flourish what lice are upon animals. Then effects upon the vegetable system are analogous to the vermin above named upon the animal system.
