Cultivating Carrots.

The soil best suited to this crop is a sandy loam, though it flourishes on many varieties of deep soils. and in preparing the land, therefore, care should be taken to ameliorate it thoroughly, and to facilitate this, as the carrot delights in a deep soil, subsoil ploughing is highly necessary. The ground should be broken up as early in the spring as the season will admit of; the manure (a compost of ashes, leaves, street sweepings, &c; also, well decomposed barn yard manures are the best fertilizer,) should be spread over the surface before ploughing. Alter ploughing, the ground should be well har rowed and made perfectly level. When you are ready to plant, which in this climate is generally done from the 1st to the 10th of May, the ground should be marked out into drills, eighteen inches apart; the seed, which should previously be mixed with some moist sand mould, or powdered gypsum, which prevents the beards from adhering to each other, and hastens germination, should be dropped in these drills and covered slightly with an iron rake, say about half an inch in depth.

4 The seed of a preceding year's growth should be planted, and if sown in the drill two pounds of seed will be sufficient for an acre. After the young plants appear above the ground they may be thinned out to within four inches apart in the rows, and if in some places the seed fails to come, the ground may be advantageously occupied by plant ing rata bagas in the barren sports, which, though the same time with the carrots.

During the forepart of the season the plants re. quire frequent hoeings and weedings, as it is in the earliest stages of their existence that they demand the most attention, for let them but once get a good start of the weeds and they will need no farther care till the time for harvesting them arrives.

They should be harvested from the latter part of October to the middle of November, and instead of digging them with the spades, the cheapest and easiest method is to run a one-handed sub-soil plough directly under them, which will not break or otherwise injure them. By this process they are not disturbed from their original upright position, but are loosened so that they can early be taken out either by hand or with a fork. The topshould then be cut off within an inch of the root, and instead of wasting them they should be fed to the cattle, who relish them extremely. The final process, if they are not marketed immediately, is to bury them in beds of dry sand, and in which, 41 properly constructed, they will remain till spring uninjured by the frost. Carrots frequently succeed various crops without any regular rotation, and it has been proved by experiment that they may fol low each other for several years without any very apparent exhaustion of the soil.

The average yield per acre is from four to six hundred busfiels, though not unfrequently they have been known to produce a thousand bushels.

The best variety for field cultivation is the O.ange, though the Belgian, or White Carrot, also vields well.

The carrot is next in point of nutrition to the potato. Hogs and cattle, especially milch cows, do well upon them, and for carriage horses, mixed with oats, there is no food equal to them, they keep the animals in good spirits and are of value also for their medicinal properties, but for work horses they are rather too light tood.

Raising Potatoes.

the following description of his mode of planting and raising good potatoes:-

"I have farmed in northern Illinois for the ten years, and have never failed of raising a good crop of Potatoes. True, every crop has not been alike good, for much depends upon the season; but I have never had a poor crop. My plan is this: -I plant the seed ends of good sized potatoes on good ground, but never manure them. If the ground is not naturally rich, it should by all means be made so, but this manuring should be attended to from one to two years before planting of potatoes. That the seed ends are as good as whole potatoes, I have satisfied myself my repeated experiments. I plant two seeds in a hill, the rows 5 feet apart by 21, furrowing my ground one way with a light plough, then drop my seed across the furrows, which saves marking my ground one way and plough them in. This saves three-fourths of the labor of covering, (no small matter,) and leaves the ground in a better condition. Do not put them in when the ground is wet, or pay any attention whatever to the moon-that, depend upon it, is all moonshing. Plough deep and fine, making your ground as mellow as possible, and put in your potatoes in good season, but never stop to inquire whether it be in the new or old, light or dark of the moon. 
