They are then neatly raked off, the "scatterings" cleaned up, and cocks permitted to remain unopened and wholly undisturbed, till dry.

Should the weather prove tavorable, the making will proceed rapidly, and in two days from the time the grass is cocked the hay will be fit to mow This insures the entire preservation of the tops and foliage, confers a beautiful green color to the hay, and prevents the stalks from assuming that dry, hard ligneous character which they are sure to possess when made by exposure to a hot sun. Clover made in this way is never mouldy, and even should cocking, the compactness of the cocks will prevent cle is colored; which enables the public to distinguishtheir becoming salurated and a new hours, annuing.

Making hay in this manner, is a practice not yet in much tayor with American farmers; but in England, Scotland and other European countries. the "grass-cock system" of curing, has now nearly superseded every other, not only in the management of clover, but all other grasses, even the finest when cut for hay, or as 'a dry feed for domestic stock. In the case of clover, which usually grows thick and rank, the fork should always take the place of the rake, which is not required .- Germantown Telegraph.

#### The Improvement of Land.

As an art, Agriculture consists in fertilizing the soil, and making it more productive than in its natural state. This may well be styled a useful art; its object being to furnish man not only with subsistence, but with comfort and happiness. Fertility of the soil being the first thing to be attained (it being the foundation of farming) we ought to try to lean every means pertaining to this grand end. Of what avail is the best rotation of crops, the best implements, or the use of them when the land is barren. Before attempting to pursue any systen of Agriculture, let us learn to enrich our ground. The common practice with farmers who have extensive lands, is to clear a piece of ground every year. This practice has sometimes been continued until there is little or no woodland left for fuel or fences, and some of the land so exhausted as to be not worthy the labor of the farmer. I say this not as a general thing, but it has happened and may not as a caution to other future Agricultuhas been conducted upon a fair rational plan, that it is much easier to reclaim lands which have been exhausted by cultivation, than to cut down and reduce to fertility uncleared or woodlands; and renovated grounds have been known to exceed in profitable product almost any newly cleared fands .-New cleared property may at first present luxuriant crops, but they seldom continue long to yield crops large enough to pay for the labor bestowed upon them. And in all lands which have been exhausted by constant use, few (if any) stumps or roots may be found; hence three acres of such land could be farmed with more ease than one of new ground, and the labor and time necessary to grub an acre of ground, to cut down the trees upon it, and prepare it for cultivation, would be more than enough to collect and manure double that quantity s of better land so as to produce far more abundant crops. Every acre made to produce as much as two other acres by an improved management, is in effect the adding of another acre, and with the advantage of saving so much of the woodland for tuel, fences, building &c. Both religion and patriotism plead for it; it is our duty and our profit at last, even if the gains should be slow in coming.

Before proceeding to detail, the best modes of improving land, it will be proper first to mention the practices which have combined to produce its destruction. Then perhaps farmers will more clearly see the propriety of adopting the modes ! propose for its renovation and improvement. Art has always improved nature.
