soft there is any one fact in regetable physiology settled, it is, that the food of plants are gases, and some few soluble mineral sub-tauces, held in solation by water as the menstraum of solution and distribution. The principal lood of plante, is the production of the decomposition of vegetable mat ter, from the change that takes place when exposed to moisture,-forming a new material called Funue, or an incipient charcoal, that cases the dark e doring of rich soils, and possesses a strong affini ty for the oxygen of the air; which combining with the carbonaceous principles, forms carbonicgacid which combines with wate: bulk for bulk, and is the great agent for the production of live fibre in the groving plant.

The antriment expended upon, and which con stitutes the value of the rotation of crops and the constant seeding with grasses, is the roots and her bage-the toif of the surface ; and its true and only available portion is below the surface, unexposed to the sun, wind and air, and in a constant state of moisture, which is a condition absolute to its perfect and rapid decomposition.

In die old process, the vegetable matter is turned in ont, exposed to evaporation and leaching of the surface, without the ability of becoming rotted or decomposed, and a great portion of it lays in a position that escapes without charging and satural ing the soil and its contents, with the very pap and pabulum of the baby plant. The decomposings material should be below the roots of the plant. never works well above, for all the gases ascend in moist or heated soils, and come in direct contact with the mouths-the spongioles of the roots. Every one will admit that this is true with the Indian corn and potato crop-as both those articles are never so sure, as when planted on a tresh turned green sward, and the same effect are produced with the winter crops.

SEED WHEAT.

There is not much care taken in preparing seed wheat, in regard to purity, as is important and profit table to the sower. Red-root, cockle and chess are the three great impurities to be guarded against : for if any of these are sown, they multiply exceedingly, reduce the crop, depreciate the price in market and inflict a lasting evil to the land that years cannot obliterate.


