Proposing Amendments to the Constitution of the Commission.

Secretary Resolved by the female and House
of Representatives of the Commonwellth of
Pennsylvania, in General Assembly inci-That the
tollowing amendments be and the same are hereby
proposed to the constitution of the continuous atth,
under and in accordance, with the previations of the

under and lef accordance with the previsions of the tenth article thereof, of where the proof of the tenth article thereof, of where the proof of the article article and the first of the article to the Common wealth shall never exceed the aum of five hundred thousand dellars, except in case of war to repet invasion, suppress insurrection, or to redeem the public debt of the Commonwealth, and the money to raised shall be applied to the purpose for which the debt may be contracted to pay such debts, and to no other purpose.

Szorran 2. To pay the public debt of the Com-mon wealth, and debts which may hereafter be contracted in case of war to repel invasion, suppress insurrection, and to redeem the public dobt; the egislature shall at their next session after the adption of this section into the Constitution, provide by law for the orestion of a sinking fund, which shall not be abolished until the said public debis be wholly paid, to consist of all the net annual income from the public works, and alocks owned by the Commonwealth or any other funds arising suder any revenue law now existing or that may be hereafter enacted, so far as the same may be required to pay the interest of said debte semi-annually, and annually to reduce the principal thereof by a sum not less than five hundred thousand dollars, increased yearly by compounding at a rate of not less than five per centum per annum—the said striking fund shall be invested in the loans of the commonwealth which shall be cancelled from time to time in a manner to be provided by law-no portion of the sink ing fund shall ever be applied to the debt of five hundred thousand dollars mentioned in the first section of this article, but the said sinking fund shall be applied only to the purposes herein specified.

SECTION 3. The credit of the Commonwealth shall not in any way be given or loaned to or in aid of any individual, company, corporation or association, nor shall the commonwealth hereafter become a joint owner or stockholder in any company, asso-ciation or corporation in this commonwealth, or

elsewhere, formed for any purposes.

Section 4. The commonwealth shall never assume the debts of any county, city, boro' or towaship, or of any corporation or association, unle a such debts shall have been contracted to repel invasion, suppress insurrection or to defend the State in war.

PROPOSITION SECOND-TO BE ARTICLE XI. Prohibiting Municipal Subscriptions.

The Legislature shall never authorize any city, county, borough or township, by a vote of its citizens or otherwise, to become a stockholder in any joint stock company, association or corporation, or to raise money for, for loan its credit to, or in aid of any such company or association.




