THE APPLE CROP now maturing promises to be very abundant. In Western New York farmers have commonly been obliged to prop up the limbs of the trees on account of th quantity of fruit; and it is stated that on the Western Reserve, Ohio, farmers have made contracts to sell them on the trees, the buyers to pick them, at six to ten cents per bushel.


