BETTER TIME TO MANURE.—With respect to the proper time or season for putting on farmyard artificial and other manure that will depend entirely on circumstances and the convenience of the farmer. I remember this question was once put to a very shrewd old farmer by a young neighbor, who had a very high opinion of the old man's judgment and experience in farming matters; and after stipulating for a fee in the shape of a jug of ale (which of course, was very cheerfully paid) what think you was the old man's reply to the anxious inquirer? Why simply this: "Put it on all the year around." Now, although we may not quite agree with the farmer that all the year about is the best time for putting on manure, yet I think most of us agree with him that a dressing of good manure will seldom do harm at any season; and no doubt by this significant answer the old man meant to impress upon the mind of his neighbor the high value he placed upon this right hand friend.—**In my opinion, the best time for applying manure of any kind (including bone dust) to permanent pasture is when the vegetation is the most active, say in the months of April and September, if the land can be spared;—and the old fashioned custom of putting on manure immediately after the hay is carried off, is, I think, a very good one.**—*Mr. Martin.*
