

SHOCKING RAILROAD ACCIDENT.—A train on the Hannibal and St. Joseph's Railway met with a serious accident at Platte River Bridge ten miles east of St. Joseph's on the morning of the 13th, by which two laborers were drowned; George Thompson, the engineer, and two firemen badly injured, and two or three passengers slightly hurt. The bridge is supposed to have been fired by an incendiary, and was so much burned below that when the locomotive reached it the entire structure fell, precipitating the whole train into the river.

FIRE.—Wm. A. Douglas, Esq., of Clymer, informs us that a barn, containing 50 tons of hay and a quantity of grain, the property of Mr. George O. Bristol, of that township, was burned to the ground on Thursday of last week. It was set on fire by two little boys who were playing with matches.

Mr. Bristol's loss is \$1,500. He had struggled against wind and tide for years, and only to witness the destruction of all his available means in a single hour. Such are the vicissitudes of life, disciplinary no doubt, but hard to endure.—*Toga Agitor*

According to a Washington dispatch to a New York paper, information has been received by the Government, that Mr. Reed, our Minister in China had made a liberal treaty with the Celestial Empire similar to that made by France and England. We are to have a Minister at Peking. It is said that the Emperor regards our country with great favor. It is supposed the dignified neutral position we held in the late war has made an impression highly favorable. The same may be said of Russia; and it is understood that a treaty has been made with that power on the same basis as with the United States. Russia has behaved so friendly through its Admiral and Minister there, in taking Dr. Reed up the river to Tientsin, when our vessels were not able to ascend, and in other acts of sympathy, associated by a general unity of action with the United States, that we understand it is contemplated to give official expression to the Russian government of our appreciation of such conduct. The news of this treaty having been made came overland by way of Russia and Europe.

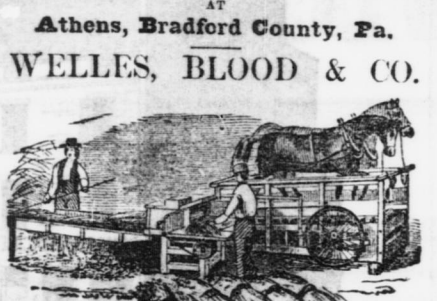
