

JOHN MITCHELL ON POLITICS.—John Mitchell, the great "Irish Patriot," and for several years past, during his brief residence in this country, a warm defender of the Democratic party recently expressed himself as follows upon the subject of politics generally:—"For three years I have been laboring in my sphere of journalism to break up the Democratic party. It is impossible any longer to belong to a party, which is dead and gone, the soul having gone out of it, and the very body torn limb from limb. If I had any credit with my fellow-countrymen, I should exhort them to seek new combinations—to isolate themselves no longer as the Irish vote—to merge in the several organizations of their fellow-citizens, and be guided in all public affairs by their own views of right and the political interests of the community in which they live. For example, I should wish to see the Irish citizens of Northern States acting with the party which desires a protective tariff for home industry, and also the largest possible extent of territory for the field of free labor. If the South felt aggrieved—as she well may, she has her remedy."
