act passed July 2d, 1830, entiled "An act relating to the elections of this Commonwealth," shall not be constructed as to prevent any military officer for serving as Judge, Inspector or Clerk, at any general or special election of this Commonwealth.

In the 61st section of the act first above mentioned, it is enacted that every general and special election shall be opened between 8 & 10 in the forenoon, and continue without interruption or adjournment until 7 o'clock in the evening, when the polls shall be closed.

By the 18th section of the act February 3d, 1846, it shall be lawful for the inspectors and judges of any general election which shall be hereafter held in the Armenia election district of Bradford County to close the polls of such election district at five o'clock, p. m.

By the 11th section of the act of 1853, it is provided that the polls of the election district of Tuscarora twp, be closed at 5 o'clock, p. m.

It is further directed, that the meeting of the Judges at the Court House in Towanda, to make out the general return, shall be on the 3d day after the election, which will be on the 9th day of November.
