He says also that many Union men have quantities of cotton hidden in the swamps to save it from falling into the hands of the rebels.

It is borne on the gale—it is flashed over the telegraph—it loads down the mails—DEAD is written everywhere. The friend from whom we have parted in robust health and in good spirit, may by the next mail be announced as DEAD. The gallant soldier who lies piled in heaps on the Peninsula are laid DEAD, so far as their earthly career is concerned; but no death can blot out their memory—they still live, and will live forever in the hearts of future generations as the saviors of the cause of freedom, which hung trembling in the balance. We have passed through the very throes of death, and now shall we not glory when the satisfaction of writing "a succession is DEAD."

At a meeting of the officers of the 5th Regiment P. R., held at their Camp near Harrison's Bar, James River, July 5th, 1862, Lieut. Col. J. W. FISHER was elected President, and Adj. A. G. MASON, Secretary. A Committee was appointed, consisting of Maj. Geo. DARE, Capt. H. C. ULMAN and Capt. A. D. COLLINS, to draft resolutions expressive of the feelings of the Officers at the loss of our late Colonel S. G. SIMMONS, and to offer our heartfelt condolence to his bereaved family.

Whereas, it has pleased an All-wise Providence to permit Col. S. G. SIMMONS, of the 5th Reg. P. R. to take to us from us, in the midst of the great struggle for the protection and perpetuation of our Republican institutions, and while he was in the very height of his usefulness, therefore,

Resolved, That in the death of Col. SIMMONS, in the struggle of the 30th of June, while leading his Brigade in the charge, this Regiment, the Pennsylvania Reserve, and the service at large, has sustained a loss that will be long and deeply felt.

Resolved, That in Col. SIMMONS was a complete history of the brave soldier, the true patriot, and refined gentleman, who by the associations of the past year had won the confidence and esteem of every officer and man in his command, and in his death we feel that we have sustained an irreparable loss.

Resolved, That we tender our sincere condolence to the family of the deceased, and trust, that although the heavy hand of affliction has been laid upon them, that an All-Merciful Providence will sustain them in this dark hour of their grief.

Resolved, That a copy of these resolutions be sent to Mrs. SIMMONS, and published in the papers of Dauphin, Schuylkill, Centre, Clearfield, Huntingdon, Union, Lycoming, Bradford, Lancaster and Northumberland Counties.

At a meeting held at Tunkhannock on the 17th of July, 1862, for the purpose of fixing the number of delegates to be sent by each of the several counties of the Twelfth Congressional District, the following conferees were present:

WAR MEETING.—Pursuant to previous announcement, a large number of citizens assembled in this place, on Saturday last, for the purpose of taking some measures for securing volunteers, in response to the call of the President. The meeting convened in the Court Room, at 2 o'clock P. M., and was called to order by JOHN A. COONS, Esq.

The following named persons were chosen officers: President—H. MERCUR, Vice President—F. BRUCEMAN, GOR. STEVENS, U. TERRY, C. S. RUSSELL, JOHN McMAHON, THOS. MATHER and JOHN F. LONG.

Resolved, That in view of the present painful and important crisis in our public affairs, and the delay and extra session of the Legislature, this meeting respectfully recommends that the Governor of the Commonwealth should at once decide upon and offer a bounty of not less than fifty dollars, to be paid to every private soldier who shall enlist in the volunteer forces of Pennsylvania, and enter the service of the United States in pursuance of the call of President LINCOLN.

C. ADAMS, Esq., a Committee to transmit the resolution to Governor CURTIN.

Resolved, That we hold it to be the duty of all loyal men to stand by the Union in this hour of its trials; to unite their hearts and hands in earnest patriotic efforts for its maintenance against those who are in arms against it; to sustain with determined resolution, our patriotic President and his Administration in their energetic efforts for the prosecution of the war and the preservation of the Union's just enemies at home and abroad; to punish traitors and treason with fitting severity, and to crush the present wicked causeless rebellion, so that no flag of dishonor shall ever again be raised over any portion of the Republic.

The meeting was addressed by J. C. ADAMS, J. B. REEVES, Col. ELIHAN SMITH, Hon. H. W. TRACY, Hon. E. R. MYER, and others, in eloquent and patriotic appeals, to all who could do so, to come forward now and enroll their names among the defenders of our glorious old flag.
