The Bradford County Teacher's Association met pursuant to adjournment at the Presbyterian Church in Rome, and was called to order by the President, O. F. Youns. The meeting was opened with reading the 147th Psalm by President and prayer by Rev. D. Craft. Music by J. G. Tucker and P. B. Bliss. In the absence of the Secretary David Craft was elected to fill the office.

Report of Committee on Business and Programme was read and adopted. It was moved and carried that the Resolutions be taken up in the order presented by Committee.

Resolved, That teachers have a greater influence than parents in forming the character of the young.

Resolved, That no person should be granted a certificate by the County Superintendent that will not or does not attend Educational meetings.

Resolved, That men who are opposed to paying school taxes should be prohibited from taking any part in the affairs of our Government.

Resolved, That a uniform system of taxation be adopted in the State of Pennsylvania, and that final divided by the number of scholars in each district.

Resolution first discussed by L. A. Lyon, A. F. Harding, David Craft, O. J. Chubbuck. Resolution laid on the table. Miss G. H. Barnes was appointed Critic. After music and adjournments, the Association took a recess until 2 p. m.

Resolution as amended passed unanimously. Wm. R. Horton then gave his method of teaching elocution. Music. Recess until 7 p. m.

Friday evening—Called to order by President. "The Yankee Boys" then sang a song entitled, "Starved in Prison." In the absence of Prof. James McWilliam, of Towanda, David Craft was called upon to address the audience and extemporized on the following subjects: 1st. A better view of what education is. 2d. A higher qualification of teachers. 3d. Mechanical or Book teaching rather than teaching thought and things. 4th. The want of higher moral views of the subject of education.

L. A. Lyon then read an essay which was solicited for the occasion in the "School Journal." Answered all questions distributed in the afternoon. Report of Critic. Declaration, Edward Thompson. Music. Adjourned to meet at 8:30 a. m.

Saturday morning—Meeting was called to order by President. Miscellaneous business taken up. Standing Session unanimously decided upon as place for next meeting. Music. 4th Resolution discussed by the affirmative and negative. Resolution carried. Kate Iveson read an essay, subject, "Sacrifices." P. P. Bliss then sang a song entitled "My Trundle Bed." J. G. Towner sang "Passing under the Red." Selected piece was read by Louise Allen of Rome. Resolution 4th discussed by Craft, Harding, Chubbuck, Young, carried. Prof. Harding delivered a declaration. It is announced that Mr. C. JEROME HOPKINS, the celebrated Organist from New York will give a concert in Troy, on Wednesday evening, and we have been informed that measures have been initiated by some of our citizens to induce him to come to Towanda.

Mr. Hopkins is an organist and composer of wide reputation, and his whole artistic career has been marked by the endeavor to elevate as well as charm the public taste. It is to the distinguished efforts of such artists as Mr. Hopkins that the public owes much of its musical culture. We are now beginning to recognize the fact, that music, like oratory, is an art which appeals to the public heart, a language which conveys the mightiest thoughts, and which needs only to be known, to become among us, as in Italy and Germany the vernal of the people.

It is an intellectual character which has always distinguished Mr. Hopkins' compositions, and he has always striven to maintain that, as Americans are more intellectual and are actuated by higher feeling than the people of European nations, American music must eventually take the lead in the world. He makes a constant appeal to the patriotism of his countrymen, and desires pre-eminence in art, as well as in freedom.

Mr. Hopkins' execution upon the Organ is something wonderful. He evokes from the pipes their hundred voices—he flings out whole handfulls of chords, harmonies and progressions of harmonies roll out from beneath his fingers—he calls forth the sighing of winds, and through all the heroic strains of humanity struggling and conquering—he throws in the minor strains vails out the requiem of mortality—and with the pedals reveals the majestic tread of conquering immortality.

We trust Mr. Hopkins may be induced to come to Towanda, and that the citizens will give him a reception worthy of his genius and reputation.

Rev. Mr. Douglass hoping to secure this great advantage for our citizens has offered Mr. Hopkins the use of the Organ in the Episcopal Church.
