STATE NORMAL SCHOOL, Mansfield, Tioga county, Pa.—This Institution closed its second year under its present arrangements on the last of June, sending out fifty Graduates. Six of these belong to Bradford county, the most of whom are engaged in teaching at good salaries.

The demand for more Graduates. Schools are calling for a higher grade of teachers. The State, in order to assist in filling this demand, appropriated at the last session of the Legislature, money to be paid to those who declare their intention to teach. Each pupil will receive fifty cents per week, or one dollar, if disabled in the military or naval service, or are the sons or daughters of those who have been disabled in like service.

It further gives to those who graduate fifty dollars when the course is completed. Making in all, one hundred dollars a year to those graduating, or eighty dollars to those who are disabled as above mentioned.

TOWANDA AND ITS PROSPECTS.—The great public improvements now being made, and proposed in the valley of the Susquehanna, upon the waters of the Towanda creek and extending into Sullivan county, are to result in very great advantage to Towanda as a commercial center.
