Guessing in Farming.

stances." This is only an example. All other farm operations should be recorded in somewhat the same manner, and then there would be an end of the continual "guessing" and "thinking" and ignorance in regard to those things we should know about.

COOKING POTATOES .- Professor Blot, in his lectures on cooking, deprecates the practice of cutting off such enormously thick parings from potatoes as is the custom of most people, to save the trouble of neatly digging out the eye, which lies deep below the surface. The lecturer's caution seems to have been directed simply against a shiftless style of manipula-tion, which wasted a certain bulk of potato. If this were the extent of the evil, it would hardly be a serious ALSO FULL STOCK OF LEATHER fault, as potatoes are cheap and plenty, and the time saved might offset

the waste of food. The truth is, however, that almost the sole value of the potato is near surface, so near that a very thick peeling would take the biggest part of the nutriment. This is at once made obvious by examining a thin slice of potato with a microscope, when the starch grannles will be found lying in the greatest number in a belt just under the skin and decreasing towards the centre. They are placed here for the nourishment of the young sprout, which springs from the and which being like beauty, "only skin deep," is required to go no deeper for its food during the germi-

nating process. This starch is, for all practical purposes, the entire nutriment which the potato contains, there being only two per cent. of gluten, while seventy-five per cent, is clear water. So if it is worth while to eat the potato at all, it is obviously foolish to throw away too noteiment and save only the wa-
