How to Select Choice Cows for Milk. Cows with a small head, slim neck horns, legs and tail, big feet, two small teats on the back of the bag in addition to the four that are to be milked, with a wide strip, or what I price as the same quality can be purceased else where. er, that is to be found on cows above the upper part of the bag behind. It will be noticed that some of our deepest milkers have a feather that is full three inches wide, with a very large, what is called milk hole, in the milk vein, the larger the better, for great er will be the flow of milk, and of a better or superior article. As for richness and flavor, the cream of all such milkers will churn much quicker, and make very yellow butter. In this country much improvement is possible in this respect, and I would commend the subject to the notice of our dairymen-that is calves may be selected that will make very deep milkers, before they are able to stand

Reader you may think this rather young to determine the qualities of cows, at this very early age. If they do not have the marks of making good milkers at this age, I think they never will at all. If it is desirable to raise calves that will make good milkers, raise all calves that have six good sized teats that are well apart, such calves make the very of milkers. It is much better that they should be in their new milk at two years old, as they make much gentler and better milkers. Many handsome red heifer calves are rais ed on account of color more than any thing else, that do not make very good milkers. I am for raising calves a circuit of Twenty Miles, on reasonable terms.

rise to this very prejudice; bad books are foisted on the public.-These are read, and they lead into error; and forthwith good and bad are condemned.

Our best men certainly are not the fools. Our ablest men, who lead in their departments, are men qualified, if any, to impart instruction. Shall we heed them, or shall we follow after our own half-formed, inexperienced notions? We have our prejudices, and they make us believe we are right, without consulting the facts in the case. - Rural World.

GRASS FOR HORSES -Many persons think that horses that are kept in the stable all summer should not be allowed to eat grass. They think it will make the horse soft, wishy-washy, and that it will throw him out of condition for hard work. This is particularly the case with some of the trainers of trotting and running horses .-And horses that are kept up for farm and other work are refused grass because their drivers think they will not cat hay so well. This was formerly the case more than it is now .--But these are all erroneous opinions and practices, and are giving way, gradually, to a more reasonable and natural system of feeding.

Grass/is the natural food of the horse. It is cooling and healthful food. It keeps the bowels open and sharpens the appetite. It promotes digestion, and removes fever from the system. Therefore, by all means, let the horse nip grass fifteen or twenty minutes daily. Horses that are work should certainly be allowed a nice nibble at grass every day. They work hard, and all they get for it is something to eat. Let them have, then, what they all like so well.—
