#### Agricultural. Various Hints for the Season-1. As the pastures become short and dry, your stock will betray symptoms of uncasiness. Some will pine, some will be ill-tempered, and some will become unruly. The way to remedy this is to increase the supply of food. This may be effected indirect ly by selling off a part of your stock; it may be effected directly by putting the animals into fresh pasture, or by heeding extra food, in vegetables,

This may tempt many to try to keep against this. 2. Be very careful to preserve spe cimens of all your ripening fruits, especially from young trees. We know some persons who have had orchards bearing several years, and who after all, have discovered this year, for the first time, how valuable some kinds o their fruit were. A little attention to this matter now will enable you to add to your number of fruit trees

judiciously. 3. Repair all leaky places in roofs : n il up all open spots in the sides of barns and sheds and provide good shelter for stock, before the heavy autumn storms occur.

4. The autumn is the best time for painting all wood that needs this protection. Paint, therefore, soon, all fences, posts, gates, sheds and buildings that need painting, whethernew or old.

5. A few days since we saw a hay rick, several plows, a harrow, a cart some ox yokes and a one horse wagon lying out of doors. They were baking in the sun, and cracking open with exposure. Near by them was plenty of room to keep them all under also keep on hand, a large assortment of good shelter. We won't tell the man's name, but we hope that when he reads this, he, and all others who have done the same thing, will put all such implements under cover.

6. Of weeds we have had an extra number and a most luxuriant growth during the present year. Some weeks ago we solicited attention to this fact, and to the necessity growing out of it for extra exertions to subdue them and prevent them from going to seed. As a large proportion of farmers are very careless in regard to the eradiction of weeds, and as such carelessness will be more productive of mischief this year than it is usually, it may not be a work of supererogation to call attention to the subject once more. Though now late, it is not yet too late to mow down or pull up these pests, and to place them in piles either for burning or for fermentation. Much better will it be, at all events, to get: rid of all weed seeds not yet scattered by winds, birds, &c., even at this late period, than to give them any additional opportunity for dissemination. Thousands of these seeds may yet be destroyed in gardens and fields. Let the standing weed be cut down and collected into piles, so as to be burned or rotted, for which latter purpose the corners of fences, where there ar any worm fences still in existence or other waste places will be the most appropriate. Sprinkle over the heap some ashes or lime, if convenient to the house, and cover with a few sods. If not next year, then at least the year after, these rotted weeds will be of some use as manure, and all danger from the seeds either entirely or very nearly at an end.—Cincinnati

## Calves "Brought up by Hand."

Enquirer.

A member of the Circenster Farmers' Club makes a specialty of rearing calves, and has read a paper before that Association describing his experience. He has been in the habit of procuring the calves dropped on the farm of a neighbor, and with only four cows of his own, raised fifty calves in 1864, fifty five in 1865, and, in 1866, fifty-five were weaned, but three have been lost by mismanagement. He takes the calves from the first of March, when ten days old, paying thirty shillings each for

They have for the first three or four days two or three quarts of milk at a meal; then gradually some food in the shape of gruel is added, and, by degrees, water is substituted for milk. Mixing oil cake with gruel is the great secret of success. I use half oil cake, the best I can buy. Take a large bucket, capable of holding six Which he is selling to suit the times, and gallons put into it two gallons of purses of all. He has also opened a splendid gallons, put into it two gallons of scalding water; then add seven pounds of linseed cake, finely ground, which is obtained by collecting the dust that falls through the screen of the crusher, and passing it through one of Turner's mills. Well, stir the TEAS, COFFEES, SUGARS. oil cake and water together, and add

two gallons of hay tea. scalding water in the morning on good sweet hay, in a tub, the tea standing covered till night, and having seven pounds of meal (wheat, barley and beans mixed) stirred into a tubfull before use. The same hay will bear a second infusion during the night, for next morning. Two quarts per head, with an equal amount

of cold water, is enough for a feed. The old plan of letting them suck through the cowman's fingers is preferred, and, as soon as they can eat, crushed corn, sweet hay, and roots are placed within reach; vetches as soon as ready, and mangolds, of which a supply should always be stored if practicable. The calves live in cool, well ventilated house, are kept very clean and quiet, supplied with fresh water daily; and the manure frequently removed.

Jersey coral, composed largely of the result. phosphatic and nitrogenous matter, is forming so rapidly as to threaten in terruption to navigation in some places. Being an excellent fertilizer, it is being collected with strong forks and grappling hooks; and in many CASH PAID FOR instances the deposits are so large and heavy that they cannot be lifted to the surface. By passing the entire mass through a crushing machine everything is reduced to small fragments. At the same time a liberal amount of dry muck is mingled with the coal for the purpose of absorbing the ammoniacal material, and thus retained it until the compost can be applied to the soil. The new fertilizer promises to be a source of rich revenue to the State.
