And so, and by said act, I am further directed to give notice "that any person excepting Justice of the peace who shall hold any office of trust or emolument in the State or any incorporated district, and also that every Member of Congress and of the Legislature, and the select and other members of the Board of Commissioners of any incorporated district, is by law incapable of holding or exercising at the same time the office of Captain of Infantry, Inspector of Cavalry, or Adjutant General of the Commonwealth and that no Inspector or other officer of any such election shall be eligible to any office then to be voted for."

As far as to change the time of closing the polls at the General and Township Elections in the County of Bradford.

Section 1. It is enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly met, and by the authority of the same, That it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That at all General, Special, and Township elections, the polls shall be closed at six o'clock in the afternoon instead of seven, as heretofore provided by law.

As a further supplement to the Election Laws of Bradford.

WHEREAS, By the act of Congress of the United States, entitled "An Act to amend the existing acts relating to the provision for the election and calling of the militia, and for other purposes," and approved March third, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, for men who have deserted the military service of the United States, or have been not yet discharged, or relieved from the penalty or disability therein provided, are hereby prohibited, and forfeited their rights of citizenship, and are deprived of exercising any rights of citizenship thereafter.

And whereas, Persons not citizens of the United States, nor under the Constitution and laws of Pennsylvania, qualified electors of the Commonwealth, shall be prohibited from voting.

Section 1. As enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and by the authority of the same, It shall be unlawful for the Judge or Inspectors of the election to receive any ballot or votes from any person, who has been enfranchised in the previous and subject to the disability imposed by said act of Congress approved March 3, 1863, and it shall be unlawful for any such person to offer to vote any ballot, or ballots.

Sixth: That if any such judge and inspectors of elections, or other persons, shall be compelled to render a verdict for any such discredited person, he, or she, or offending shall be guilty of a felony, and upon conviction thereof, in any court of justice, in this Commonwealth, he, shall, for each offence, be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than \$100, and unless he, or she, or offending, shall be compelled to render a verdict for any such person, so offending, shall be liable to a fine of not less than \$500.
