Winter is the period for farmers and gardeners to prepare for the crops of next season. Many of the duties connected with the operations of the field may be performed in winter, quite as advantageously as in warm weather. Plans for future operations may be laid, months before the time arrives for doing the work. Every farmer should have a works shop, where he can repair farm imple-	( Etili ( II
ments and store them from the injurious influences of the weather. When cold storms prevail, and highways are blockaded with snow-drifts, he should have a convenient place, where himself and boys may employ their	r

Young men like to try experiments in performing numerous mechanical operations. This is an excellent practice, as it tends to unfold and develope the powers of the mind.

Talk over with your neighbors the propriety of inaugurating a renovating system of farm management.-Excellent suggestions may frequently be obtained from common laborers, who have been accustomed to work, for many years, at certain branches of business.

Winter is the best time to procure seed-grain for sowing and planting, in the spring. This job is too often neglected until the growing season has commenced. Visit some good farmer, at a distance, and exchange seed-wheat, or seed-oats with him ; and have the grain cleaned thoroughly and put in barrels ready for use. There is a great advantage in exchanging seed of all kinds, provided one gets grain that is really fit to sow. Much of the grain that is used for seed, is scarcely fit for chicken

When the sleighing is good, and teams need exercise, it will pay to open a clay bank and haul clay and spread it over the surface of lawns and mead ws, where the soil is light. Of course, a dressing of clay, applied to a heavy soil, would not improve its productiveness. Where land has produced grass for many years in succession, a thin dressing of clay AND CANNED OYSTERS will usually produce a luxuriant growth of clover, or other grass, pay ng well for the labor of top-dressing. On light sandy soil and heavy calcareous c'ay soils, apply muck. It is better to compost the muck, if it can be done. But the trouble is, only a few farmers will do it. Therefore, let it be applied directly to the soil, while snow is on the ground. The frosts and rain will prepare it for pramoting

the growth of crops. Fruit trees of all kinds may be benefitted by spreading a dressing of iron filings, iron turnings, the sweep ings of blacksmith shops, or the lit-ter that may be collected at iron foundries, around the trees, as far as the limbs extend in a horizontal direction. It will pay to cart such material five or-six miles, when the sleighing is good, to be applied as a dressing around any kind of trees, bushes of vines that bear fruit. Such material can be spread in the desired place, even when the snow is deep. Then, after the growing season has commenced, let it be hoed into the soil.-The more of such litter the better for fruit trees. Oxide of iron imparts health and productiveness to growing trees, and capecially to grape vines; and a dressing of iron litter is incof the most efficacious securities arainst mildew, cracked, knotty and

scubby fruit, that can be employed. The present is an age of wonderful improvements, in almost every department connected with agriculture, horticulture and pomology. And yet, there is opportunity for still further developments. Improvements can be conceived and plans laid for their accomplishment, as well in winter as at any other time.

The mechanical department is many years in advance of the agricultural. The cultivation of the soil is too greatly neglected, except on certain farms. Thorough cultivation and fertilization have accomplished wonders in some sections of the country. The satisfactory results in the line of bountiful crops of grain, and stock of crops of choice vegetables and fruit, on numerous farms, should encourage tardy cultivators of the soil to adopt a renovating system for the ensuing year. The choice sheep, the beautiful horses, the fine cattle and swine that are found in large numbers all over our country, are the result of the efforts of thinking and laboring men One common mistake with a large proportion of American farmers in

overstocking their land, and a want of thoroughness in their operations In many instances, two cows are kept, when if the same feed were appropriated to the maintenance of only one good cow, the yield of milk would be much larger than, from two cows. Here is an opportunity for improve-

The same is true, in certain instances, of field crops. If one acre were cultivated thoroughly and brought up to its greatest productiveness, by the application of rich manure and frequent plowing, a given quantity of grain or vegetables could be produced at a much cheaper rate, than to raise the same amount on two or three acres, by the common, superficial sys-

tem of husbandry. Farmers and gardeners should keep in mind the beautiful and important compensation principle of paying back to the soil a full equivalent for every crop raised. We can't cheat the soil. If the ground is manured with straw, the burden of straw in the next crop will be heavy, and the yield of grain or vegetables light .-Fertilize the seed bed with grainproducing material, and the crop.o grain will far exceed the usual yield.
