Common Sense in Farming.
A discussion before the Board of Agriculture of Maine, on what is called "Mixed Farming," has many suggestions that will be of great value to those who give their consideration to it. It contains an element which is not always found in discussions of matters connected with agriculture, and that is the element of common sense. In our opinion farming has been conducted from time immemorial with too little regard to the teachings of common sense. In old times it was the farmer and manager who just as their fathers did, without inquiring whether this was the best way. They put in the crops at the same time, in the same month, and cultivated them in the same way, and got just about the same returns. Whereas, if they had exercised a little common sense they might have had some other crop that would have been far more profitable, or a much more abundant yield of the same. They did not reason about the matter, but followed a track, which had been well beaten before them.

Farmers at the present day, especially what may be called fancy farmers, have gone to the other extreme. With them the cardinal virtue has been to disregard the past, to strike out some entirely new course, to do all their farming on some particular theory to which everything must be made to conform. If they have not taken to raising hobby-horses, they have taken to riding hobby-horses, until many a one has been ridden to death. Every farmer ought to be a reading and thinking man, looking into what is new, to see what value there may be in it; but farming is essentially a business, and to be conducted not so much on theory as on experience. A theory may be very splendid, but if it does not work well, it is worth nothing at all. An inventor of some fertilizing material, for instance, may make it as clear as the sun, on paper, that it contains all that is requisite to insure an abundance of this or that particular crop; but it does not cause the crop to grow, if it proves a failure when it comes to be applied to the soil, it will not be worth any more to the farmer than a recipe for making moonshine out of cucumbers.

The great thing for each and every man to do, after getting all the suggestions and information that he can, from others and from books, is to exercise his own common sense in cultivating his ground. Let him not be governed by any mere theory, or by any rule of the past, but by the nature of his soil, the situation of his farm, the circumstances of his family, and a variety of considerations which cannot here be named; but especially by his own observation and experience upon his own farm. Experience is the result of experiment, and this should not always be conducted in one direction; but common sense should be the judge to which all questions should be left for decision. — N. Y. Observer.

Soft-shelled Eggs.—An English poultry manager suggests the following treatment: "When a hen lays this sort of egg, and not habitually, the occurrence is generally accompanied with hard or full crop. In that case, it is owing to indigestion, and the treatment with one or two teaspoonfuls of English gin. One cause is said to be over-feeding when fowls are four fat. These eggs are generally dropped from the roost, and if it is not too high from the floor, or if they fall on straw, may be saved entire, and used for puddings. As to symptoms, experience will make known the indications, and the time when a hen is about to pass one of these eggs, by appearing somewhat dull and uneasy when walking about; when proper precautions should be taken to secure it, and prevent the other hens from gobbling it up. The writer has a favorite hen, which always regularly drops these eggs from her roost, and never lays any others, and has done so for these years past, although in perfect health." Probably the medicinal effect in American gin would be quite as efficacious as that of "English." We give his statement for what it is worth, with the remark that the trouble is equally considered due to a lack of food in the food, and this is supplied by giving the hen shells, bones, and other forms of lime.

Soil Under Buildings.—Whenever soil is covered for any length of time by buildings or other objects which prevent transpiration, nitre or saltpetre is generated, and this is greatly accelerated if the building is occupied by animals, especially by the horse. This soil is of great value to the farmer for removing and applying it to his soil. In compost it is highly useful. As a top-dressing, few articles are so efficient, and when applied in sufficient quantities to all light soils, and in conjunction with lime or wood ashes, it acts with great vigor, and secures most healthy and most vigorous growth. The percentage of alimentary matter contained in grass, manured with nitrous earth, has been exhibited to be greater than that supplied by an equal weight of hay grown on land manured with pure nitrous substances simply. It is also more palatable, much more elastic in the fibre and foliage, and consequently less liable to loss, as well as more easily cured. The soil under stable floors, barns, wood-houses and stable floors, should be removed and saved every three or four years, and replaced by muck or some other substance which will be transformed into manure. This is, always supposing the earth can be conveniently got at.

Remedy for Bots.—A half pint of vinegar, half a pint of soft soap, half pint of good lard, and one pint of molasses; shake well together and pour down while foaming. It will cure in five minutes; never known to fail.
