

News from all Nations.

Major Gen. Hooker is now reported to be in Detroit, and rapidly improving in health.

A dispatch from San Francisco reports considerable damage to shipping by the recent tornado on the Mexican coast. The schooner *Florida* capsized off San Blas, and all hands with the exception of the Captain, were lost. The schooner *Hogade* was sunk at San Blas, and the English brig *Cecilia* was driven ashore in Bandera Bay, and will be a total loss. Other disasters, involving less loss, were also mentioned.

On Friday last the house of Dan McGrady, in Fair Haven, Conn., was entered by burglars, and \$100, which he had earned by opening oysters, was stolen.

Prof. Perry, of Williams, will deliver before the Junior Class, the great term, forty new lectures on the Constitution.

J. H. Appleton, of Portland, Me., has been elected Professor of Chemistry at Brown University.

Patrick Leach, of Westville, Conn., who was hired, for \$1,000, to kill James Gorman, of New-Haven, has been arrested, with two other persons, for attempting the crime, and held in \$5,000 for trial.

The Massachusetts Homeopathic Medical Society declare against the use of butter, which they say "contains no element of food required by the human family."

Josiah L. Pike, who has been on trial for some days, charged with the murder of Mrs. and Mrs. Thomas Brown, at Hampton Falls, N. H., has been found guilty and sentenced to hang on the 10th of November.

On Monday night a party of Kuhn, in Marshall County, Tenn., went naked to the residence of a colored man, named Louis Lilly, from him and his family, and carried him a short distance from the house and shot him dead. There was no charge of any kind against him except that he was electing for Grant.

Wormwood and Oldwin, the giant pugilists, who were arrested and held to bail in the sum of \$5,000 each, for prize-fighting at Lynn, Mass., on Thursday, were released, their friends having clubbed together and given the proper bonds for their appearance in January next for trial.

The Texas fever having again broken out among the cattle in Hamptonburg and Montgomery, N. Y., State Commissioner J. C. Smith has published a letter detailing the symptoms and the course of treatment which should be followed. He says that it is only possible to restrain the further spread of the disease, by the most rigid isolation of all the diseased animals, and the most careful disinfection of the places where they may have been.

Late advices from Rio Janeiro state that Gen. Lopez, with all his force, was at Villeta, and that the forces of the Allies were within a short distance of him. A battle was momentarily expected. The Portuguese Consul was taken by force from the American Legation and shot. The commander of the United States war steamer had sailed up the Paraguay River with his fleet, and demanded redress.

The State of Illinois adopted a new seal on the 25th inst., just fifty years and two months after the day on which the State was admitted into the Union. The design is an eagle on a border in a wreath, the rising sun in the distance, and in the center of the eagle is a scroll bearing the words: "State Sovereignty—National Union." There is also introduced the American shield, as adopted by the original thirteen States.

Two men and three boys were killed near Cincinnati on Thursday night by the explosion of the boiler of a locomotive attached to a gravel train. Two other persons were severely wounded. All but the three boys were railroad employees.

The Washington Mills at Lawrence, Mass., were damaged by fire Thursday morning to the extent of \$20,000.

Hon. George Biss, formerly member of Congress from the Fourteenth District, Ohio, died Thursday afternoon, at Wooster.

A planning mill at Montreal was burned on Tuesday night, and the watchmen on duty perished in the flames.

U. S. SENATOR FROM PENNSYLVANIA.

There seems to be no lack of material from which to choose a Republican United States Senator in place of Mr. Buckalew. Already have been mentioned the names of Thomas M. Marshall and James K. News of the Week.

Requisition has been made by Gov. Fenton on Gov. Fenton of New York for the delivery of a large number of New York soldiers who were captured by the Grand Jury of that county for conspiring to violate the election laws. Among them are Henry W. Grant, Peter Norton, George Mitchell, Florence Seammell, Lewis Baker, Rocky Moore, George Dougherty, John Green, Edward Tolly, Michael Fitzgerald, and others.

Since the October election a large number of election officers have been arrested and held to bail for refusing to recognize naturalization papers issued by the Supreme Court in September. On Saturday all the bills were ignored by the grand jury. In the test case, Judge Brewster, in giving his decision, sustained the election officers in refusing the votes of certain parties on election day, holding certificates of naturalization signed by J. Ross Snowden, the prophatory having failed to recognize his own signature and seal of his court in open court.

A petition contesting the election of Daniel M. Fox, as Mayor, has been filed in the Common Pleas. It represents that the true vote of the city was 59,770 for Tyndale, and 57,000 for Fox, giving to Tyndale a majority of 2,770. The specifications of fraud, &c., are similar to those in the other petitions filed in the case of the other officers. The 14th of November has been fixed for the hearing.

Judge Read's term at "Nisi Prius" began Monday morning. At the opening of the Court, District Attorney William B. Mann, accompanied by a committee of electors and merchants, called attention to the loose manner in which naturalization was carried on in "Nisi Prius" in September and October.

Judge Read declared that the whole issue of naturalization papers by the Court of Nisi Prius was contrary to the laws of the United States and of the State of Pennsylvania, and that the papers issued by that Court are illegal, and should not be received at the polls as competent evidence of citizenship. Judge Read calls attention to the acts of Congress on this subject, and orders that hereafter no more aliens shall be naturalized in the Court of Nisi Prius. There is no doubt that Judge Read is sustained by a majority of the Court.

The Judge then added: "I have been informed that it is the intention of bodies of men, organized in the City of New York and Baltimore to come to this City on tomorrow to illegally vote. I desire to warn these people, in my capacity as *ex officio* Justice of the Peace, and as a Judge of the highest Criminal Court in the Commonwealth, that if they are detected in such violations of the law they will be punished to the full extent of the law. I may add that I have resided in this City, of which I am a native, for seventy-one years, and I never before heard of such outrageous conduct as that practiced at the election held on the 13th of October last; and with the gentlemen of the Grand Jury I unite in calling upon our best citizens, without regard to party, to aid in preventing a repetition of these scenes."
