The Redemption of Greenbacks.

One of the most important bills to be introduced at the coming session of Congress is one by Senator Morton, providing for the redemption of greenbacks. He will urge that the sales of gold be discontinued, and that the surplus of gold in the Treasury and that which is to accrue be appropriated for the redemption of the legal-tenders. His bill will fix the time for beginning the redemption, by way of illustration, in January, 1871.
