Trenchshe ground two herbis of the spade, manuring it well all through. Lay off on the prepared ground beds of four feet, having a path of two feet between. Lay off on these beds, one row through the centre, and one twelve inches from each side. Set the plants carefully along these, distributing the roots properly, and then put over them when planted several inches of good oam, and a good dressing of compost. Whiten the surface well with salt. Such treatment will make sure a large product, and a bed that, with good management, will be profitable for many years.
