The materials to be well mixed, the beef thoroughly rubbed with it, and packed as closely as pos- sible in a barrel. If pounded down in packing, so much the better. No water need be added.   BOLING POTATORS.—Let the water hoil before putting the potatoes in. When done, pour off the water and scatter three or four teaspoonfuls of salt in, cover the pot with a coarso cloth, and return it to the fire for a short time.
