Household Recipes.
To Whiten Straw Hats.—Scrape sulphur with a knife, mix the powder to a mush with water, plaster it thickly over the straw, and place in the hot sun for several hours; brush off when dry. An easy and effectual plan.
Lingulae (Ling)—Dissolve lingulae in water and strain through coarse linen, and then add a little of spirits of wine. Evaporate it to such a consistency that when cold it will be dry and hard. This will hold together than common glue, and is much preferred.
To Take Grease from Paper.—Generally warm the parts containing the grease, and apply blotting paper so as to extract as much possible. Boil some clear alcohol of turpentine and apply it to the warm paper with a soft clean brush. A little rectified spirits of wine should be put over afterward.
Stuffed Beefsteak.—Cut a thick slice from the round, in shape as near an oblong square as possible. Remove the fat and pepper to taste. Make a stuffing of stale bread and fat salt pork; season with salt, pepper, sage, etc. Roll it up in the steak; sew the edges of the slice together with strong twine so that none of the stuffing may escape. Bake in a quick oven.
Baked Scallops.—Shells (very pale), four ounces; cauliflower (cut in a bright copper pan, over a clear charcoal fire, and when fused add Venice turpentine, one and quarter ounces; mix, and further add vermillion, three ounces; remove the pan from the fire, cool a little, weigh it into pieces, and roll them into circular sticks on a warm stone slab by means of a polished wooden block; or it may be poured into moulds while in a state of fusion.
Home Made Ink.—The ink is a beautiful black, flows freely, and does not in the least corrode the pen. It is far superior to the usual acid inks, which will spoil the best steel pen in a few hours use. In fact, we have no ink that we like so well as this. It is made thus: To five gallons of water add boiling heat, add one-half pound of borax, one-half ounce bicarbonate of potash, and one-half ounce potassium carbonate. Your ink is then made and ready for use. The cost is six cents per gallon.
Washing Colored Fabrics.—"Before washing any colored fabrics," says the Scientific American, "it is recommended to soak them for some time in water, to every gallon of which is added a spoonful of ox-gall. A tea cup of lye in a pail of water is said to improve the color of black goods when it is necessary to wash them. A strong clean soap on five acres will preserve the color of French linens. Vinegar in the rinsing water for pink or green, will brighten those colors, and soda answers, the same end for both purple and blue."
