The report of the Commissioner to San Domingo, has been transmit ted to Congress by the President, with a message which is so moderate in its tone, and so unassailable in its conclusions, that it will meet the approval of every candid-man, whatever he may think of the policy of acquiring the island in question.

The report is too lengthy for our columns, and indeed it adds but little to the general facts and information already given by the correspondents who accompanied the expedition. It is made, it should be borne in mind, by a committee of gentlement who
