Preventative for Boats.
EDWARD BARRETT.—Dear Sir: In your issue of June 16, I notice an article on bats, by Mr. Cummings, and for fear some noble horse may unfortunately get that awful dose which he prescribes, I hasten to remark upon it. Now, please look at it: "Three quarts strong sage tea, one quart alcohol, two quarts hen manure, one quart rain water." Quid? Should the rain water be dipped up from a little puddle in the barnyard? Why not? Now, I suggest that the alembic has our own share of cheap molasses added to it, so that it retains some brown paper with the mixture, and when you sell the same for lightning fly-ticks! Take the two quarts hen manure and the water (either rain or barnyard water), and mix well together; then, with a little brush, sprinkle it on cabbage plants, cucumbers or other vines in the garden, and you will see the bugs scatter, and your plants or vines grow. To the lump of chalk you may add a little vinegar, and clean your brass kettle!
