

THE HORSE EPIDEMIC DISEASE!

It appears in Philadelphia - How it affects man.

The Canadian horse disease, which seems to be of a diphtheric type, and at certain stages approaches diphtheria, first showed itself in Rochester, New York, on the 24th of October.

It soon attacked every animal in the city, and in less than twenty-four hours over five hundred animals were suffering from it.

Soon after his return one of his horses was attacked by the epidemic, which is the course of a couple of days affected his whole stable.

At 6 o'clock on the morning in question, Mr. Edward Fee, proprietor of the livery and boarding stable on Cherry street, above Fourth, Philadelphia, saw one of his horses give unmistakable evidence that he had been attacked by the disease.

Next to this establishment is the stable of Francis D. Kramer & Co., liverymen, No. 39 North Second street, where two horses were attacked in the day.

The first symptoms of the disease were a cough, and afterwards a discharge from the nostrils, accompanied by a swelling in the throat.

They were attended by two veterinarians, who were unable to detect the cause of the disease, but who were eventually able to cure them.

At different times, from 15th November to the 7th of December, several other cases of the disease were brought to the attention of the State Agricultural Society.

The only cause of itself capable of producing the disease is contained in the secretions of a diseased animal with the virus discharged from the sores of an animal patient.

NOTICED during almost every outbreak since that of 1865.

It has been known to occur among others by Van Hook, Kerley, Kolk, Hestur, Rayer, Bouquet, Loude, Sevigny, Dundrey, Hubner, Holmes, Balfour, Karcock, and Watson.

It was first noticed in Albany, and at South Down, Dutchess county, N. Y. during the outbreak of 1870.

It shows itself in man by slight feverishness, and the formation on the tongue and inside of the lips and cheeks, and sometimes on the head, of small vesicles, usually amounting to the bulk of a lentil.

In children and young animals feeding exclusively on milk, diarrhoea and fatal inflammation of the stomach and bowels occasionally supervene.

On chickens it has been frequently noticed - especially by Lemmick, Lagar, Lamborloch, Dickens, and Yonatt. Chickens were attacked in December, 1870, on the farm of Mr. Eglome, La Grange, Dutchess county.

Drinking the cast-away milk is probably the common cause. Dogs and cats have been noticed by Lagar, Young, husband and others, to suffer from drinking the milk.
