LOST OPPORTUNITY.

When the rebel HILL was arraigned before the government, and charged with crimes at Elmira in the treatment of the rebel prisoners that he expected at Andersonville, it was expected that every loyal representative from the North would contradict the base slander. Especially was such a course anticipated from members living in the immediate vicinity of Elmira.

CONGRESS.

The Amnesty debate occupied the House most of the time last week. President JOHNSON received the customary eulogies in both Houses on Tuesday. In the Senate the most notable speeches were those of Mr. GREENEVILLE, of Kentucky, the only member of the present Senate who voted against JOHNSON'S impeachment, and Mr. PAINE, of Ohio, who introduced a bill looking to the resumption of specie payments.

Good for the Grangers.

An exchange says: "Crawford County, Ohio, is excited at an attempt of the Grangers to control the election of officers of the Agricultural Society and to put a stop to horse racing at agricultural fairs. The Grangers triumphed, and it is asserted that this will be followed up in all parts of the country where the Grangers are strong, by efforts to exclude professional riders from all agricultural fairs."
