Household Recipes.

**BLACK PEPPER FOR CABBAGE WORM**—A correspondent in the *Indiana Farmer* says: "Last year was a very bad one to get cabbage to head, the cabbage worm was so bad. Below I give a remedy that is sure death to them. For every hundred head of cabbage take a quarter of a pound of black pepper and put in a box large enough to sift out well. Go into the patch before the dew is off and pepper them well. Two or three times will be sufficient. The worms go through the leaves and die."

**SORE THROAT.**—A gargle of salt and vinegar, with cayenne pepper, will do more to disperse soreness of the throat than any other remedy of which we have heard. It stimulates the glands, promotes free secretion and will sometimes cure in a few hours.

**TO DESTROY INSECTS.**—A wine-glassful of paraffine to four gallons of cold water, applied to plants is a sovereign remedy for the destruction of insects. Ants and bugs often destructive to rosebushes, are killed almost instantly by paraffine water.

**TO STOP BLEEDING.**—Take the fine dust of tea, and bind on the wound. This is at all times accessible and easy to obtain. After the blood has ceased to flow, a few drops of laudanum will help close up the wound.

**BOILING SALT MACKEREL.**—After freshening, wrap in a cloth and simmer for fifteen minutes; remove; lay on two hard-boiled eggs, sliced; pour on it drawn butter and trim with parsley leaves. Boiling salt fish hardens it.

**FRENCH JELLY CAKE.**—Take three eggs, one cup of sugar, three table-spoonfuls of water, one cup of flour, two spoonfuls of baking powder; beat the whites and yolks separately; then beat all together; season with lemon.

**LEMON PIE.**—One cup hot water, one tablespoonful corn starch, one cup white sugar, one tablespoonful butter, juice and grated rind of one lemon; cook for a few minutes; then add one egg, well beaten; bake with top and bottom crust. This makes one pie, and is very nice.
