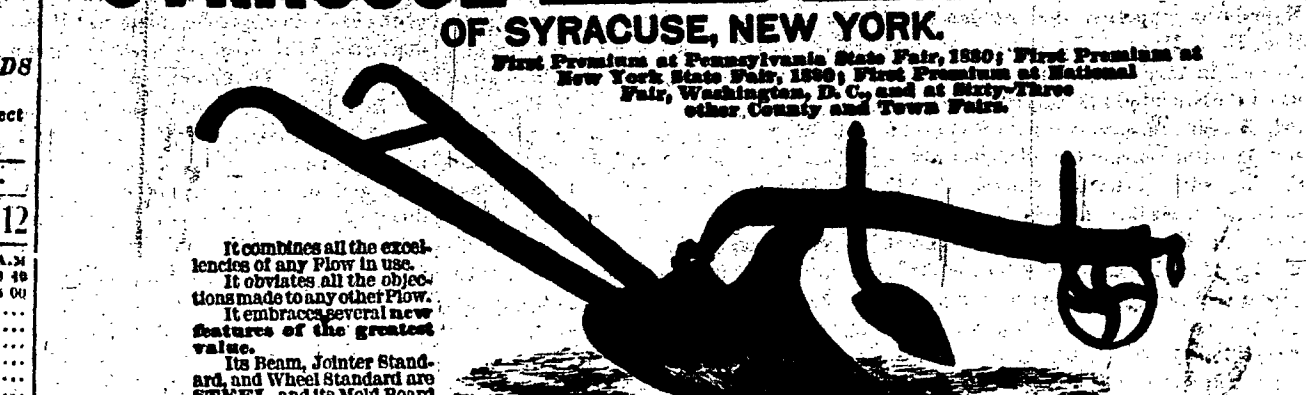

THE CORN CUT-WORM.

We noticed briefly in a late number, the discussion at the Elmira Farmers' Club on this insect, which is so often destructive to the corn crop. In a late number of the Reporter we observe the following directions for destroying it, given by Secretary Armstrong, which may be useful to some of our readers...

There is really but one way to save the crop after the plants are once attacked by cut-worms—that is to dig the worms out and kill them. It is not a difficult task, nor is it very costly.
