THE COURT AND LICENSES. The following resolution appears from the report of proceedings to have been unanimously adopted at the Good Templars' Convention recently held in Cauton: Resolved, 4th, That inasmuch as the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania rules that the granting of licenses is wholly at the discretion of the district judge, we shall continue to remonstrate against the granting of any licenses to sell intuxi-ca ts, leaving the judge and petitioners to take all the responsibility of forcing these permicious pest houses into our

The grave errors embodied in this resolution prevail to a very wide extent among professed temperance people in this state, and ought to be corrected.

They canuot, Pilate-like, wash their hands of blood-guiltness in this matter by simply remonstrating against the granting of licenses in obedience to the law which has their authoritative sanction. The policy of the law is for license. It authorizes the Court to grant licenses. "It stands as substanti. Hy enacted by the Legislature that repealed the "local op-"tion law." This law submitted the question of granting licenses to the direct vote of the people. Its repeal took that privilege from them, so that they cannot reach the question only through the Legislature and Executive. Once admit that a judge may set up his own private opinion as to the wisdom of the policy of a law, and administer it instead of the law, and your give him power to practically repeal law. If he could thus practically repeal it in one case he might in others, and thus law-making and it uses would be practically nullified. The private opinion of the judge would become the law.

The Supreme Court makes no such grant or refuse a license is entirely within the discretion of the Court of Quarter Sessions and no appeal lies therefrom." Sec Toole's Appeal th, Norris page 376, 🛮 The discretion which the law gives the Court to grant or refuse license on a particular application does not extend to the general question of setting aside the policy of the law under which that discretion is given.

Here is the language of the Supreme Court on this point also, "Whether licenses should be granted is a legislative not a judical question. Court sits to administer the law fairly as it is given to them and not to make or repeal it."

.The Court may c celare the law inoperative when it conflicts with the Constitution, not because the Court has any authority over law, but because the Constitution is a higher law and must prevail. And what is the Constitution but a higher law adopted by the people, the source of anthority. If the law does not represent the will of the people, it is so because the people do not represent their own will in casting their votes. They choose their agents to make their laws and instruct them in the platforms they endorse. It is cowardly, base and unjust, to charge upon the judge the evil conse quences of a bad law which the Court faithfully administers. The real criminal is behind the Court. When Governor Hartranft, Nero-like throttled all the anti-license voters in the state, the great mass of them were choked into silence and said by their votes, amen! we submit to be slaves to the rum power, and wear the party shackles. And ever since they have tramped upon the treadwheel of party machinery till the shacklegait has become second nature.

Temperance republicans, and temperance democrats, please remember, the responsibility is upon you. That the keepers of "these pernicious pest-houses," keep them by your authority. "We have yet to learn that an agent is more criminal than his principal." O. J. C.



A Fertilizer From the Air. Nitrogen is the most costly ingrelient that enters into the composition of fertilizers. It is sold in the shape of ammonia, which is composed of nitrogen and hydrogen. The air is nitrogen (four parts) and one part oxygen, uncombined; that is, both are in a free state, ready to be extracted whenever desired. Oxygen is much used, because it forms compounds readily with a great many substances, but nitrogen is a substance that has beretofure baffled the most experienced chemists. It ATTENTION IS INVITED to can be taken from the air, but does not combine with other substances first-class like oxygen. It forms ammonis in the manure heap only at the moment of liberation from some substance into which it previously formed a part, and the hydrogen must be lib erated at the same time with it

en and hydrogen). Many attempts have been made to orm ammonia directly from the sir. but the experiments have not been satisfactory. Nitrogen, however, has been derived from the air by a roundabout process, but the compound was cyanogen (carbon and nitrogen), a very dangerous poison, and the active principle of prussic acid. It is reported, however, that certain New England parties have succeeded in artificially combining hydrogen and nitrogen, forming ammonia gas, which, by being passed over muriatic acid, is turned into chloride of am-




