Report of the County Controller—Final Condition of the County.
Henry Lambert, Co. Controller, reported to the Board of Commissioners, at its meeting on the 27th inst., the final condition of the county for the year 1923. The report is a detailed statement of the financial affairs of the county, and will be published in pamphlet form for the information of the citizens. From a study of the report it is seen that the financial condition of the county for the year 1923 was a very gratifying one, notwithstanding the losses of the railroad industry.

The total ordinary expenses for 1923 were \$9,000,000, while the total ordinary income for the year was \$9,100,000. The excess of income over expenses was \$100,000. The Rights of a Deserted Wife.

Chief Justice Woodward, of the Supreme Court, has rendered the following opinion in the case of *Ward v. Woodward*, appeal from the District Court of Philadelphia:
