D., of Nenia, Ohio, delivered the annual address before the Association. He gave a brief history of the Alumni. The Seminary was established in 1825 by the Associatio Reformed Church, and the Rev. Jaseph Kerr, D. D., was chosen sole Professor. He served faithfully and well-fer a period of about four years, when doubt terminated his earthly life, and the exercises of the Seminary were partially suspended. In 1863, the venerable John T. Pressly, D. D., was elected Professor of Theology—D adactic. His time was short. In 1847, the Rev. A. D. Clarke, D. D., who still fills the situation, was elected Professor of the same department tha elected Professor of the same department that was rendered vacant by the death of Dr. Din-widdie. In 1851, the Rev. D. R. Kerr, D. D. was elected Proressor of Ecclesiastical History and Church Government. Five professors have been connected with the institution, two of whom are dead. From the year 1825 to 1864, 423 students have been encolled. Seventy-three have died. A fow have engaged in semilar pursuits, and three hundred have entered the ministry, some of whom are in-
