It is not for us to make our charity dependent upon the acquittal of the people of Chambersburg of all responsibility for the destruction of their property, but it is our manifest duty always to clothe the naked and feed the hungry without stopping to inquire how they became naked or hungry. In the present instance, no criticism that can be made upon the action of the people of Chambersburg can, by the most illiberal application, be made to apply to the women and children who were driv-

en from their homes into the open fields. Let there be prempt action. A few thousand dollars, which can easily be spared by this rich community, will alleviate a vast mmount of suffering. Pittsburgh should not now forget, nor do we believe she will, a chapter in her own history, when a calamity similar to that which has befallen Chambersburg. called forth the material aid of almest every city in the Union. Let us therefore resolve to act the manly part by promptly providing money and clothing for the Chambersburg Bufferers. Philadelphia and Harrisburg have already made liberal contributions for their relief-the latter city having raised ten thou-Band dollars at a public meeting on Monday zight.

A statement has been made to us by an old citizen of Chambersburg concerning the burning of that town, which adds additional weight to the charge of incompetency which has been made against Gen. Couch. The statement is substantially this: That General Couch, commander of the Department of the Suequehanna, whose headquarters were at Chambersburg at the time of the late raid, informed the citizens on Friday afternoon last, at two o clock, that the Rebels were coming, and immediately afterward commenced to pack up his effects, and actually left Chambersburg that evening, accompanied by all the soldiers then in the town, numbering, according to our informant, about fifty. It was, this precipitate action on the part of Gen. Couch which led the people of Chambersburg to be liver that resistance to the invaders would be useless. Our informant asserts most positively that, if Gen. Couch had remained in Chambersburg during Friday night and organized the citizens, they, in connection with the fifty soldiers, would have been abundantly able to prevent the burning of their town.
