WASHINGTON, Aug. 17, 1864. As army letter, dated Army of the Potomac August 16:h, 10 a. m., says : Yesterday morning the 10th corps was withdrawn from their posi tion on the enemy's extreme right, on the north rad west blaff of the James river and Deep Bot. tom, and thrown, by a most magnificent maye ment, upon the enemy's extreme left. At dark last night our forces had turned the robel fortifications on our extreme left, and were driving the enemy towards the James river and the fortificaone of Richmond, it being four or five miles distant to either. Affairs could not possibly be n a more promising shape than they were last hight at dark when the firing coased, with an inention, on our part, of ronewing the attack eary this morning.

The 10th Corps and 34 Division of the 21

Corp. did most of the fighting yesterday, the 2d Division of the 2d Corp., under Gen. Barlow, and Cof. Smythe, of the 1st Delaware, having spectively covered themselves with glory the day before. The firing yesterday afternoon was e's having been turned on their left, and there eing consequently little use or chance for artil-ery on either side. Our less on Sunday were some three or four hundred killed, wounded an i miss ing. The enemy's loss was perhaps not quite so lear, with that of the enemy being much more they leaving some of their killed and wounded
