SHELETVILLE, Ky., Aug. 27 .- Twoive guerriilas enteted this place about daylight this morning, and compelled a negro black inith to hold their hoist, while they commenced breaking in the court house door. RESULTS OF KILPATRICK'S EXPEDITION. OURTFER M LES OF THE MACON ROAD DESTROYED.

CIRCIEBATI, August 27 .- The Gasette's Atlanta lipatch says: Kilpatrick destroyed the Macon allroad, at several places, for a distance of fouren miles, and captured and burned a train of upplies on rout: for Atlanta. On his return he supplies en routs for Atlants. On his return he met the rebels in strong force and totally defeated them, capturing four stand of colors, twenty-four cannon, and two hundred prisoners. He afterwards met another force which pressed him so heavily that he was obliged to abandon all but one of the guns and most of the prisoners. He made the entire circuit of Atlants and reashed Decatur with a loss of 169 men. Severe damage was done to the rebel communications.
