The following has just been received at this office: Harrisburg, Monday, Aug. 27th.—Sharp fighting occurred from daylight, yesterday, until about five o'clock, p. m., in the vicinity of Dunker Hill, between Federal and rebel forces.

At Smithfield the enemy was pushed forward, and Ouster was compelled to retreat, where he was joined by the brigades of De Groot and Gibbs, the latter forming the main body of the rebel force.
