During the last twenty days, the whole mercantile community has been exised with a paralysing caution. Although the markets are generally light scoked, and the interior is uniformly reported to be have of goods, yet buyers, with one-consent, have refused to purchase their erdinary stocks at the high prices demanded. The result has been a general decline in prices; which we far from it ducing buyers to operata, has only increased the indisposition to buy.

The natural result of this state of things has been an almost general effort to force sales. The dry goods jobbers have repeatedly marked down their prices, and are now selling much below the quotations of the importers' and mannufacturers' agents. desired amount at their reduced prices, they are now throwing large amounts of domestic fabrics into the anction room, producing at each successive sale a till further decline, and giving greater impetus movement.

This movement is the dry goods market is a fair representation of what is occurring in other kinds of merchandith. The decline also extends to raw materials and imported produce. Cotton has declined within fourteen days 50c per ib., and wool 2c.; and neither is saleable in any considerable amount at the reduced prices. Tex. office, sugar and sploes participate in the downward movement, and the metals begin to sympathize also. As yet, breadstuffs and provisions have resisted the decline with considerable firmness; the cause, doubtless, being the sittemps of Western speculators to hold back supplies from shipment until near the close of navigation, in order to keep stocks light the east during the Winter—N.
