THE APPROACHING DRAFT.

There is no department of the Government that seems to us so much in need of improvement as that of the Provost Marshal General. The orders issuing from that office are often hard to understand; and they are so often countermanded, reversed and explained that a Philadelphia lawyer has not half sufficient skill to unravel them.

Just the reverse of this should be the case. The department having charge of the draft should make its orders clear, explicit and cally inderstood; and all the details of its modes of operation should be sharply defined. A draft is always unpopular; and the way to intensify its unpopularity is to introduce dosut and uncertainty into the methods of carrying it into effect.

The pending call for 800,000 men was made, as the call states, to supply the deficiencles left under previous calls. The prac ical operation of this is to throw the bur den of filling the new call upon the loyal districts of the country. The disloyal portions of Pennsylvania failed to fill previous demands upon them; and the loyal portions must now make good their default.

This is bad enough, and hard enough for the loyal people to bear; but just as they are settling down into the determination to grin and bear it, here comes General Fix ith an additional order that no district shall have any credits for men furnished prior to Dec. 19, 1864! And so the fat i in the fire.

Many districts in this county furnished nore than their share under the call for 500,000 men. and some of these have been steadily furnishing men since under the conviction that every man furnished by them would count on future drafts. But no, Gen. Fuy says that no man furnished prior to December 19th shall count, no matter how much in excess of previous calls the numbers eo furnishod may be. What is the use, then, people will ask, of being loyal ? What inducement is there to

The reason given for this ruling is that 800,000 men must be put in the army under this call. Very good. Then every man furnished since the previous call, by districts which honestly met all demands on them under that call, is just so much towards filling the number under the new call, and there is no justice in excluding them. The government has got the men and those who furnished them should have

due credit for them. The people, we fear, will cry out against this thing of taking snap judgment on the districts that have been furnishing men for three months prior to December 19th.
