Twenty-four years is not long in the life of a city; yet when we look back to 1840 we see how great has been the growth of this city within that comparatively shor period. We give below the total vote in this city and, its immediate neighborhood in 1840 and 1884, at the Presidential Elections of those years; and a glance will show how rapidly the territory immediately adjoining the two cities has filled up with rulation.

Allegheny, city has the same corporate limits now as then ; but the fourth ward alone now polls more votes than the whole city did then. The total vote of that city in 1840 was 1406 ; in 1864 it was 8898. Surrounding the city, on the north and west, in the former year, was the township of Reserve, which then policd only 100 votes. Since then, Manchester and Duqueant boroughs and M'Clure township have been formed out of parts of it, and the four now cast 1706 votes-about 8 to 1. . . The city of Pittsburgh proper then am-

braced only the first five wards of the present city. Beyond it on the cast lay the township of Pitt, stretching from river to river, out of which four large wards have since been cut, and alongside of it, Pecbles township, out of which Collins Lownship has since been framed. These are

whole of Pitt township polled only 584 votes in 1840, while what is left of it and the the wards framed out of it, new poll 3797 votes. Lawrenceville, which also lies just cast of the city, has increased its vote from 116 to 824. Taking the whole of this little strip which twenty-four years since girdled the city on the east, the increase is from

On the south the increase is a little greater. In 1840 the township of Lower St. Clair stretched from Six-mile run to Chartlers creek, and polled 528 votes. Out of this has since been formed the boroughs of East Birmingham, South and West Pittsburgh, Morongahela and Temperanceville, and the townships of Union and Chartiers, not to speak of a considerable slice that was cut off in forming Baldwin township. These, excluding Baldwin township, now poll 3175, or more than 6 to 1.

Our attention was called to this contrast on looking over the table of the vote for President in 1840 and comparing it with that of 1864, and as it is so instructive we give our readers the benefit of it. We append the table of the election districts which may now fairly be regarded as constituting one city. The total vote of this city district in 1840 was 6,538; it is now 20,978, showing that the population has nearly Quadrupled in 24 years :

This society was organized, originally, on the 2d day of Februsry, 1778, and re-organized May 8th, 1787 a few days before the convention met that framed our National Constitution: From that time to the present, a few philanthro-pists in the "City of brotherly-love," imbued with the spirit of the illustrious and distinguished HowARD, have, through the couperation of some of the friends of haman lty in different parts of the State, been devoting their energies towards the securing of s-reform in the execution of prison dis-Mno throughout the Commonwealth. / cip Their operations have been carried on so silently that their organization has scarcely been known to have an existence. In June last, Governor CUBTIN gave letters to a confinities, appointed by the Society, "requesting that they might be allowed to id examine the prisons and poor

houses throughout the Commonwealth, and the address before us contains an ab stract of the reports made by these special agents. Particular attention is called to the construction of prison houses, separate confinement, cleanliness, order, propriety and moral and religious instruction. In all of these there is much room for improvement. So far as our experience and ob servation go, we would say a radical ra-form is demanded in the whole system of prison discipline. The unfortunate inmates f our jails should be supplied with suitable

books and receive regular moral and rellglous instruction. It will be remembered that the attention of the people of this county was called to the subject of moral reform in our prisons, by the Grand Jury o the October term of the Court of Quarte Bessions, through their foreman, Major William Frew. As yet, little has been some in the matter, but we hope that philanthropists will now bestir themselves, and that the Legislature will bestow upon the subject that attention which its importance
