THE FREEDMEN'S BUREAU. Congress has passed the act to establish a lurcau for Freedmen. The bill passed is of in the shape in which it was introduced, hut has been modified or changed by the Committee of Conference between the two houses. We are not able, therefore, to speak definkely, about its' details; but it is nough to know, for the present, that the policy of confiding the care of the Freedmen to a distinct branch of the Government, has been endorsed by Congress, and that a measure of far-reaching influence and importance to ILe colored race has been consummated, to far as the action of Congress

is concerned. The close vote by which this bill finally passed the House, 64 to 63, was owing, we s ust; more to opposition to its details than . to the grand principle involved in the bill. It can hardly be that any Republican gave

a negative, vote through opposition to the policy of creating this Bureau. The separate department of the Govern-

ment thus created, responsible alone to the President, and supported by military power from him, is, according to the origin bill, to take charge of the abandoned lands

of the rebels, settle them with freedmen, guard the intrests of the latter, aid in adusling wages, in enforcing contracts, and protecting these hitherto unfortunate peoe from Injustice, and securing them, their liberty. The commissioner of the bureau and his agents is entrusted with power to establish regulations, and cause them to be enforced, for the protection of this great class, and before any civil or military court they are to act as their legal advisers. In certain cases they may hire out the freedn on with suitable persons at a proper compenestion. The assistant commissioners and sgents can, under certain specified conditions, be tried by courts martial in their n spective districts.

The original bill of Mr. EILIOTT, of Massachusetts, contained a provision repealing the section of the confiscation act which mited the confiscation of real estate to the life-time of the rebel owners. We are not advised whether this soction is included in the bill as it came from the Committee of Conference, but if so it would not hurt the bill in our cycs.
