Interesting Ejectment Suit. An interesting lawsuit, involving the title to hundred acres of valuable land in Ohio township, in this county, is in progress of trial in the Court of Common Pleas, before Judge Mellon. The parties have the whole neighborhood in at-The parties have the whole heightonia to tendance as witnesses. Archibald Boyd, it seems, died in January, 1864, aged about eighty-five rears, leaving six children and two grandchildren years, leaving six children and two grandchildren of a deceased daughter, who died about two years before his decease. Old Mr. Boyd entered into an article of agreement by which he conveyed feighty acres of his farm to George Boyd, his eldest son, and twenty acres to his daughter Eleanor, and leaving but very small pecuniary legacies to his other children and grandchildren. This ejectment is brought by Archibald Boyd, a son of old Wm. Boyd, and by the two grandchildren to set aside the article of agreement, and the deed made to George and Eleanor Boyd, upon the ground that at the time of the orecution of the title papers old Mr. Boyd was "feetbeminded," and under "undue influences."

The case has already occupied three days, and excites very general interest. Manhall & Brown appear for the plaintiffs, R. S. Woods and J. R. Large, Esqu., for the defendants. The arguments on both sides have been summed up, and the

court will probably charge the jury on the case this afternoon. Violation of Ordinance. A number of drivers, employed by Messrs. foothead & Co., and Graff, Bennett & Co., in anling metal from a vacant lot on Grant street, hanling metal from a vacant tot on Grant street, I car Fourth, were arrested and taken befare Mayor Lowry on a charge of violating the ordinance prohibiting driving over the aldewalls. These men, in hanling away metal from the lot in question, drovadfirectly over the parement, breaking the bitch and rendering the sidewalls impassible for pedestrians. Compilaints were made by the citizens in the neighborhood, and the parties were arrested as stated. The memorrs of the two firms above mentioned notified the blayor that they would have the parements repsired immediately, and would see that their employees did not again oftend in this way. Under these conditions no fines were imposed, but if the parties are again found transgressing the ordinance, the heaviest penalty will be inflicted upon them. Parties have no right to drive over the eidewalks without first protecting them from injury by laying down timbers of sultable thickness.

Disorderly House Case.

On Wednesday night, several of the Mayor's police were dispatched to the premises, when one of the number, (officer Wm. C. Wray,) rapped for admittance. The door was then opened, when the broad-faced and portly Wray walked in. Mrs. McAamas, who had conducted the conversation on the inside of the door, was taken all aback, and expressed her surptise by exclaiming "you death of the house, Mrs. McAdams, Elizabeth Sweiger and Margaret Roxbury, were then taken off to the lockup, and kept there until this morning, when they were cummitted to jail for vagrancy, for thirty days each. They are all the hardest kind of cases, and ought to be driven out of the community.

The Increase of the Police. A writer over the signature of "Lex" wh evers the Disputch with his lucubrations in reintion to the recent "wise and politic" increase of the Police force, makes a fains, though labored fifor to prove that the action of the Mayor and Police Committee is without authority and in "open violation of law," and quotes section first, chapter first of the city code, to prove the correctness of his view. As the measure is one which meets with almost universal and hearty approval, and which this writer himself acknowledges may be necessary "to protect, life and praperty;" and as the Mayor of this city is conceded by the same writer probably to have had "excellent intentions" in thus providing for the emergency, the question is narrowed down to the single point as to whether the Mayor and Police Committee had legal authority for their action.
