The CONNELLVILLE RAILROAD.

Flat Manufacturers.
In the early history of this country flat was an important item, which centered around its manufacture. Our grandfathers considered a knowledge of spinning and weaving an indispensable accomplishment, and every girl was induced into the practice of these household arts. In those days cotton was scarcely known, and our cloth was woven and woollen, both the product of hand work. The raw fabrics were carded and prepared for manufacture by hand, for a long period, but carding machines were finally introduced, and our cloth was woven into "rolls" which were spun by hand, and subsequently woven by the power loom. But no machine was used to prepare the flat, and its manufacture was continued by hand till its use was superseded by cotton.

In the early manufacture of this article, the weaving was done by hand, the yarn being spun by machinery and then distributed throughout the country to be woven. After this, the manufacture of flat almost entirely ceased, and when in the progress of cotton manufacturing the power-loom was adopted, the question was settled, and the manufacture of flat was to be abandoned. The fabric, however, survived, and remained a fitting tribute to the industry and manual skill of the mothers and grandmothers of this country.

Occasionally, now, there are families where the flat has descended and is treasured as a legacy. Much that has been lost to the world is still preserved in the homes of the old people, and it is a pity that it is not more generally recognized and valued.
