DRAFT ASSOCIATIONS.

We stated yesterday editorially certain facts in regard to the draft. The law seems to be as clear as the noon-day sun. We are satisfied no lawyer in the State would decide differently. But it seems that some military men look through other glasses—so that other men do not see them. We have been accustomed to see military men for nearly two years; first the Provost Marshal decided that a colored man was not the "military equivalent" of a white man, though the act of Congress made no distinction; next he decided that payment from a contribution by a drafted man did not exempt him for three years, the same as though he had paid a substitute. The law, however, indeed every man of common sense, knew these decisions to be absurd; yet for a long time the public was compelled to submit, till reversed General Fox, who, unfortunately for the service, left him in the hands of his absurdities, which he rolled out in the shape of orders and circulars by the hundreds, to make the matter worse, his subordinates at Harpersburg, and in one example, ground out discontent music from the same as a "military march."

In the face of the law (Section 14) Gen. Hinks orders that "no man shall be drafted in any association connected with the war," which means they reside until after the principal members of the clubs are drafted. This is without a shadow of authority of law. Section 14 of the act of March 3 requires that "all persons hereafter inducted into the military or naval service, who are substitutes, substitutes, representatives or otherwise, shall be drafted to the State, and to the ward, township, precinct or other enrollment sub-district where such persons create their actual residence."
